

PJ's Page

Is it just me, or do the months during an election year seem to have more days in them? More opportunities for the mudslinging, partisan rhetoric that has, unfortunately, become the hallmark of political campaigning.

Between now and the elections, I believe that one of the most faithful responses we can have as the people of God is to hold go, folks are our nation and its leaders in prayer.

And, thus far, the need for us as Christians to carry out the work Jesus called us to do, indeed the work that God has mandated, has not changed. The prophet Micah put it this way: "God has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" (Micah 6:8)

Do justice. Love kindness. Walk humbly with God. This is no small order. And yet, as God's people, called and sent into the world, these are the directives set clearly before us. And so, when we are faced with a decision or an opportunity or a setting or a challenge, then we can ask ourselves these questions: Is this the just action? Am I showing kindness? Can I imagine myself, in this action or inaction, walking humbly with God on this journey?

One of the most recent ways we responded with justice, kindness, and humility was during our week of working with Mary's Place. We were again blessed beyond measure by the women and children who were our guests during this week. My utmost gratitude to Karen Olsen for her tireless work in organizing this effort on behalf of this congregation and to all of you who helped in some way. From meals to hospitality to overnight

hosting to financial contributions.....you showed what it was to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God.

It is my fervent hope, each election season, that we will be blessed with leaders who also hold such mandates before them. That our politicians would consider this call as a call to the leadership of our nation. And as we approach election season, I want to repeat to you what I have said before...I will not preach politics from the pulpit, but I will speak to justice. Who you vote for is your decision and I will not attempt to influence it. But THAT you vote is a justice matter, and it is likely that I will remind you to do so.

Between now and the elections, I believe that one of the most faithful responses we can have as the people of God is to hold our nation and its leaders in prayer. Whether we voted for them or not, whether we agree or disagree with their positions, let us both individually and as a community hold these women and men in prayer before the One who is the true ruler of all the nations.

INTERN UPDATE: Just the FAQs

Our seminary intern, Inge Williams, will arrive in Seattle in early August. Her first Sunday with us will be August 5th. We are fervently working on putting everything in place for her arrival. We hope that you will add her to your prayers. Here are some Frequently Asked Questions about having an intern:

• How long will the intern be here? Internship is a twelve month

assignment, with time off for vacation and continuing education. This year, that means from August 2012-August 2013.

• What do we call our intern? Traditionally an intern is

referred to by the title Vicar. So, just as we call our pastor, Pastor Julie, our intern will be Vicar Inge.

Who teaches the intern?

We are ALL her teachers! She will learn, from us as a congregation, more about what it means to be a pastor in the church. She will be formally supervised by Pastor Julie. In addition there will be a Vicar Care Team, who will offer feedback, both formally and informally.

• Is an intern paid?

In the ELCA seminaries, interns receive a minimal monthly stipend, along with housing, health care, and travel expenses.

• Are the Vicar and the Pastor like Batman and Robin?

Probably not....after all, Pastor Julie drives a Subaru not the Bat-mobile!


SUMMER STUDY -Reading the Bible Again for the First Time



News for the congregations of the Northwest Washington Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America

July 2012

Beyond The Local Congregation by The Rev. Wm Chris Boerger, Bishop



Who is the Synod? What does the Synod do? These are the question that begin adult forums when I visit with congregations on Sunday morning. As we approach the 25th anniversary of the forming of the Northwest Washington Synod, it is a matter of

some concern to me that we still do not have a clear identity with many members of the synod.

From a constitutional perspective, the synod is made up of the baptized members of the congregations located on the territory of this synod. The synod is made up of approximately 43,000 baptized members of the congregations and mission starts which are in this area. That means that you are the synod.

What we do is a more complicated question. Members of this synod serve on local committees and boards for numerous organizations throughout the region. Members of this synod financially support their congregations and a variety of institutions and agencies either affiliated with the church or not. Members of the synod have elected a bishop and a Synod Council; these members of the synod do specific types of work on behalf of the synod, things that are mandated by our constitution and the larger church.

Most importantly, the Northwest Washington Synod is engaged in starting new ministries and helping existing ministries grow. Currently this synod has 16 ministries that are being explored or that are officially under development. These are primarily in ethnic communities other than the dominant northern European culture. Our Candidacy Committee works with over 50 candidates for one of the rosters of this church; we are raising up leaders for the future of the whole church.

When congregations are in leadership transition, the synod staff works to assist by appointing interim pastors or by working with call committees to surface names for consideration in the call process. When invited, we work with congregations to help them resolve conflict. Our Director for Evangelical Mission, Pastor Jerry Buss, works with stewardship education and planning. Jerry also works with congregations with mission planning, redevelopment and ministry extension grants. The Director for Evangelical Mission is a position funded by the churchwide expression of the ELCA, deployed to work out of the synod office. The Synod Council has established liaison members to each congregation in the synod. I want to thank these leaders for their work in connecting the activity of the local congregation to the larger church.

There is much more we could be doing together as the Northwest Washington Synod. In the coming months we will be looking at the mission of the synod, your mission beyond the local congregation. What will you do as a member of the synod?


