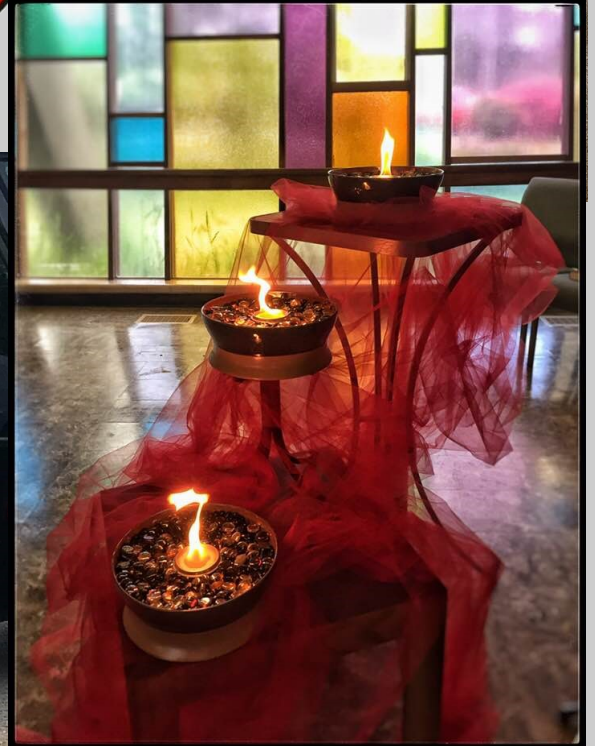
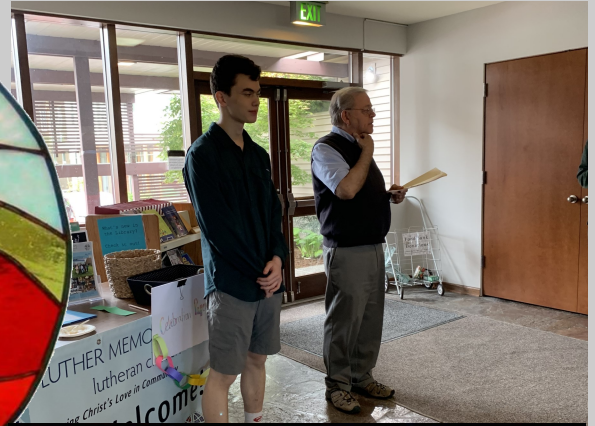

Have you ever been so busy that life felt like one of those merry go rounds on a playground? The one where you're hanging on while someone else is spinning it as fast as they can? The spinner eventually jumps on and everyone shrieks as the merry go round flies around and around. I get a little green around the gills just thinking about it.

This was never my favorite piece of playground equipment. It was just too much. And I had no control. I couldn't get off when I wanted to and I couldn't control the speed.

Sometimes, life feels exactly like that.

Sometimes, congregational life feels exactly like that.

We have been through so much....so much wonderful stuff and some pretty hard stuff too. This congregation has done incredible work. We've done the kind of work that most congregations who are far larger with far more resources find daunting.

So we are going to take a break.

When Ordinary Time arrives on June 17th, we are going to move into a mode of rest. A posture of being that focuses on worship, social time together, and only the essential Council meetings. All committees and teams will take a rest. (Of course, your paid staff, including your pastor will continue to keep their tasks moving forward.)

If we were to adopt this posture of rest and Sabbath keeping for the entirety of Ordinary Time, it would take us all the way to Reformation Sunday, at the end of October. We don't plan to do that. But we'll let you know when everything picks back up again.

In the meantime, beginning on June 17th, you are invited to lay aside any busy work you hold in this place. Focus on God. On God's goodness. On God's invitation to rest and renewal. Your Mid Week updates won't offer a lot of "information"; rather they'll offer some practices for Sabbath and some reflections on resting. We will still gather for Table Talk Happy Hours, because that's not work, that's a form of rest, too!

At the end of this time of rest, we'll consider three questions together:

What did you miss?

What didn't you miss?

How did this practice make you think about our ministry going forward?

I'm so looking forward to this experience with you. We all deserve it and God invites us into deeper solitude, deeper relationship with the Divine, and a more restful way of being in the world.

In the midst of this rest, I hope you will make worship a priority.

16 Pray that we will always listen for what the Spirit is revealing to us and pay attention to how the Spirit is guiding and urging us throughout our baptismal journey.

17 Remember in prayer the many agricultural workers who travel across our nation to do the difficult and often unnoticed work of planting, tending and gathering crops so that the world may be fed. Pray that they receive fair wages and medical care, have safe housing, find support and encouragement in communities of faith, and be affirmed for their important work and service.

23 There is no affliction or problem in life — spiritual or physical — that is beyond God's power, mercy or ability to heal. Praise God!

24 Remember our outdoor ministries and camps during this very busy time of the year and pray for God to sustain and energize staff members and volunteers so they can greet every new camper with a freshness of spirit and faith that is infectious and inspiring.

25 Remember in prayer victims and survivors of gun violence across our nation. Ask God to nurture in us the strength, wisdom and compassion we need to provide steady care and support for those who ache for healing and relief from their pain, grief, suffering, anger and fear.

26 As people of God gathered in communities of faith, give thanks for how God comes to our aid, sustains and comforts us, is present and patient with us, cares for the poor and suffering, guides us in ways of justice and peace, and invites and equips us to share in this hope-filled, life-giving work in the world.

27 The ELCA "Three Sides" podcast shares unique stories, perspectives and diverse voices of our members, congregations and global companions. Give thanks for its ministry of expanding our awareness and our understanding of how God calls and uses us in every expression of the church.

28 Pray that ELCA congregations, synods, colleges and universities, seminaries, outdoor ministries and other related organizations involved in special appeals and fundraising be successful in their efforts to start, grow or sustain ministries and programs for the sake of accomplishing God's work in the world.

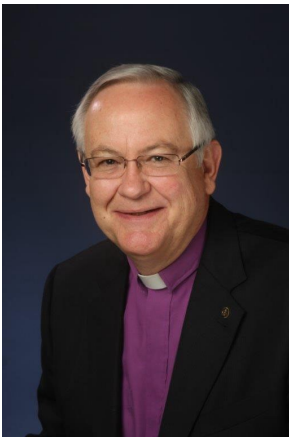

Life in Between

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus was going through the region between Samaria and Galilee.

As he entered a village, ten lepers approached him. Keeping their distance, they called out, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!"

Luke 10:11-13

Our Synod Staff has been dwelling on Luke's story of the 10 lepers for the last several months. It has come to our attention that the story takes place where many, many Biblical Stories take place, "in between places." In this case Jesus encounters the lepers in between Samaria and Galilee.

There is a practical reason for this. The lepers would not have been welcomed in Samaria or Galilee. They were living in the only place they were allowed, on the margins. Given that Jesus was constantly on the move plays right into the likelihood that we will encounter him in between place.

But there is more to this than geography. The story of faith, hope and love is forged "in between." For Abraham and Sarah it was formed in between the invitation to leave behind family and home and the promise of becoming a great nation. For the Israelites it was in the wilderness between Egypt and Promised Land. For the people of exile it was between living in a strange land and the hope of returning home. For the disciples it was in between the sea of Galilee and the cross. And then there is the most holy of time between Good Friday and Easter Morning.

I have never been good at living "in between." The uncertainty creates anxiety for me. I want to know the out-

come. I just want to get there. Forty years in the wilderness would have done me in.

It is not easy for me to live in the present. I am often seduced into wanting to go back to the way it was or jumping ahead to what is waiting for me. Little did I know how prophetic the words of those were who said to Kim and me, "Enjoy your children because they grow up way too quickly." It is in the space and time of "in between" that we come to know, to love and to trust. It is precisely the place we are called to live.

Northwest Washington is entering "in between" time. In between two bishops.

Please welcome Rev. Shelley Bryan Wee. Bishop-elect Shelley and I both are leaning into this in between space knowing that it is sacred encountering space. I encourage you not to look back or to race ahead. Rather welcome this new time and our new Bishop and take up residency in it. It is where we encounter Jesus.



Once Jesus was asked by the Pharisees when the kingdom of God was coming, and he answered, "The kingdom of God is not coming with things that can be observed; nor will they say, 'Look, here it is!' or 'There it is!' For, in fact, the kingdom of God is among you." -

Luke 10:20-21

Operation Brown Bag



Lunches are handed out Monday-Friday, 10 am—Noon to all who are hungry.

Our volunteers prepare a well-rounded sack lunch for this program.

The following items are typical of what goes into the sack lunches:

- **Proteins** - Small can of Vienna sausage, packet of tuna or salmon, a tuna or chicken salad lunch and cracker kit. (Must be able to be opened without a can opener).
- **Fruit** - Fruit cup, applesauce or raisins.
- **Drink** - Juice box or pouch. Additional bottle of water, when available.
- **Dessert** - Pudding cup, gelatin cup or small pack of cookies.
- **Grains** - Small bag of chips, package of crackers, and/or a granola bar.
- **Care Items** - We always hand out individually wrapped hand wipes i.e. Wet-Ones. In warmer weather, spring/summer we give out sunscreen, lip balm, and extra water if we have them available.

If you'd like to donate supplies, please drop them off at the church. If you'd like to ASSEMBLE lunches, please email/call the office to get starting directions. Lunches can be made at any time that you have time available to volunteer!
