

Operation Brown Bag

Lunches are handed out Monday-Friday, 10 am—Noon to all who are hungry.

Our volunteers prepare a well-rounded sack lunch for this program.

The following items are typical of what goes into the sack lunches:

- Proteins Small can of Vienna sausage, packet of tuna or salmon, a tuna or chicken salad lunch and cracker kit. (Must be able to be opened without a can opener).
- Fruit Fruit cup, applesauce or raisins.
- Drink Juice box or pouch. Additional bottle of water, when available.
- Dessert Pudding cup, gelatin cup or small pack of cookies.
- Grains Small bag of chips, package of crackers, and/or a granola bar.
- Care Items We always hand out individually wrapped hand wipes i.e. Wet-Ones. In warmer weather, spring/summer we give out sunscreen, lip balm, and extra water if we have them available.

If you'd like to donate supplies, please drop them off at the church. If you'd like to ASSEMBLE lunches, please email/call the office to get starting directions. Lunches can be made at any time that you have time available to volunteer! **THANK YOU** to all the current volunteers and those donating items!!! This ministry wouldn't be possible without YOU!
