

Pastor's Article

Let us celebrate the festival, not with the old yeast, the yeast of malice and evil, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth. I Corinthians 5:8

So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! II Corinthians 5:17



The NYTimes ran a story the morning of my writing this that a "variant of the variant" is posing great difficulties in Europe and Asia. I know that you share with me the difficulty in knowing how to think about all this. I know this, because you tell me.

And then there is the war in Ukraine – a war that is difficult to understand and seems more complex in its origins, conduct, and possible resolution than most can imagine.

Amid all this (and so much more!) the Church makes the unrelenting journey toward Easter. We make it with Jesus by our side. It is a journey that takes us to the cross, but that does not end there.

Before we jump too quickly to the empty tomb of Easter's promise, let's stay focused on the cross. It is in the cross that all the ambiguities of our present lives are wrapped together in the amazing love of Jesus and overpowered. We have trouble making sense of it, this way of overcoming difficulties with surrender. Yet this is what Jesus shows us, and as all of life's uncertainties, suffering, pain, and death are taken by him to the cross, God makes of them a New Creation.

So many of the stories in this Lent and Easter season point us to the wonder of God's New Creation in Christ. Again and again we see how the world we have spoiled, the relationships we have squandered, the sins we have committed are swallowed up by the love of Christ that brings from the empty tomb new hope, a new beginning. *If any are in Christ, there is a NEW Creation...*

The thing about creations is that they are living, moving, organic organisms – just like the people who inhabit them. That would be you and me! We can't always predict what our own next move will be, so how can we possible predict how and when even God's creation can shift and change? ("Do I need a mask, or don't I?")

The Good News of the Easter Gospel is that in all that happens, God's will for the Creation and for us is LIFE – Life in all its fullness. As we live into the New Creation won for us on the cross by Jesus, as we look to what brings LIFE to the world around us, we are truly living as Easter People. It doesn't bring an end to all life's troubles and quandaries, but it DOES give us the gift of approaching them with unrelenting hope.

Did you know? This March it will be three years since the first tenants moved into Compass Broadview!

A liaison team, BDV/LMLC Partnership, meets the first Tuesday of each month to get updates and find out how we can continue our support to those who live there. What a vibrant ministry, led by Anne Bailey and her team. Covid has taken a toll, but about 75% of the current residents have been safely housed for the three years. Eighteen residents came directly from homelessness. We continue our collaboration by helping with events and donating when needed.
