FROM PASTOR SARA FUNKHOUSER

I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. —Isaiah 43:19

We have been in a time of great transition, dear Luther Memorial Community. With how much has happened in the past month, it feels hard to believe that I have only been serving as your pastor here for the past few

weeks. Between COVID, my ordination and installation, our first few worship services together, and the start of my time at Foss Home, I have certainly been busy in my time here and we have been through a lot of new experiences together.

When I was in the interviewing process with you all, I was invited to meet the Council and lead a devotion. I chose a portion of Isaiah that contained the reading above. Not only because this Isaiah reading happens to be both one of my favorites and the class verse for my graduating class at Wartburg Seminary, but also because Isaiah speaks to the process of transition. The prophet Isaiah speaks about things being similar to, but not the same as they were before because God is continually up to something new and is inviting us into that newness too.

In this time after Pentecost, we are able to reflect too on all the newness that God brought when God sent the Spirit to dwell among God's people. Things were not the same for the disciples after and they would not be the same moving forward, just as we too are called into the newness that God is working in the world and in our community.

We know some of what this newness will look like here at Luther Memorial, i.e. a new pastor, a deeper relationship with Foss Home, etc. but the rest we get to be open to listening to and figuring out together. So, thank you all for your grace and your patience. I know that pastoral transitions come with both excitement and some changes, as well as the process of building trust and developing relationships with one another.

From my first interview, I was able to tell that God is up to something in this community and I could feel the love that you all have for one another and this place. And, I have been anxiously awaiting the start of our ministry together! I am looking forward to continuing to learn what makes this place and you all so special and to seeing what God is calling us to together. I am so glad to finally be here as your Pastor!

June expenses exceeded receipts this month. Payroll expenses will be higher each month as we move into our 4th quarter of our budget.

The June receipts include designated/restricted income of \$3,353.32. Income (as well as expenditures) this month are higher due to grant money received for Kaleidoscope Play and Learn. Income/expenses flow through to support this program supported by LM. This does reflect an amount in the total of the June receipts that are not used for general budget expenditures. This needs to be taken into consideration each month as we view our receipts for the month.
