Dear Luther Memorial Friends in Christ,

Today (8/31) is my dad's birthday! Ole Jordan Moe would be 102 years old today. I am filled with happy memories, many of them right here at Luther Memorial. Dad loved God with all his heart and he loved this congregation. I was just talking with my sister, Christine, about how he treasured the traditional, "high church" rituals, but he'd occasionally surprise us with his embrace of more contemporary ideas.



I try to imagine Dad here, in 2022, and wonder what he would think of all that has occurred since his last Sunday in church 32 years ago. So much has changed, yet our primary calling, our mission, remains the same. As I sat here early this morning, trying not to stress over the as yet unwritten letter to you all, the words & music from this hymn seeped into my sleepy mind.

"We are called to act with justice, we are called to love tenderly; we are called to serve one another, to walk humbly with God." (David Hass)

One of the most transparent ways we show our love and service is through our Little Free Pantry ministry. Pastor Sara & I are meeting with Mary H. and Diane C. to fine-tune our purchasing practices in order to be better stewards of this vital community resource. We are also searching for community partners that may work with us to supplement the pantry with food items and/or monetary support. Please let us know if *you* have any resource connections!

One way we can help feed our neighbors while also helping to reduce our home clutter (I'm pointing to myself here!) is to participate in the church Rummage Sale on September 18th. Bring your gently used, unwanted items to church and we will use the proceeds from the sale to bolster our pantry budget.

While brainstorming with Pastor Sara, we focused on "multi-benefit" events. A rummage sale benefits our members in reducing clutter, aids our neighbors in finding something useful for their homes at a reasonable price, and helps our neighbors when they can access a well-stocked pantry. How about a benefit concert? We can plan a lovely evening of live music in our sanctuary and collect a free will offering that will support the pantry. How about a special dinner in Celebration Hall? (Gordon, are you listening?!) It could be a fancy \$\$/plate feast with proceeds going towards our food ministry, and/or we could host a community potluck with a free will offering. Ideally, I'd love to see us move towards hosting a soup supper once a month for our neighbors. There are so many ways to make meaningful connections within our community! What are *your* ideas? If you have an idea to share, please don't hesitate to reach out!

Please be informed of the Luther Memorial financial status with this snapshot of our **Quarterly** report. Full reports are available upon request.

When looking at a quarterly financial accounting of the budget, the incoming revenues fall short of the total expenses. This is a trend for this time of year. Monthly expenses spike at different times of the year. Revenue also has its ups and downs. All are encouraged to be diligent in our giving when possible.

We are working with James Culver to learn more about navigating the operation of the thermostat for the new furnace. He has been such a great support. The furnace has an air circulation fan that brings in more clean air. This has been set to come on, Sunday mornings. We should feel a difference. Thank you, Jian, for being part of the conversation. So much to learn.

There is a thought of having a fall clean-up to prepare the outdoor gardens for winter. It would be our hope to gather a few helpers to accomplish this task. More information to come.
